Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Open Science Partnerships in Translational Neuroscience

A full-time postdoctoral position working on an inter-institutional and interdisciplinary research team that includes Co-PIs, Jacqueline Sullivan (Associate Professor, Rotman Institute of Philosophy, Western University), E. Richard Gold (Professor, Faculty of Law & Director of Centre for Intellectual Property Policy, McGill University), and Jonathan Kimmelman (Professor, Biomedical Ethics and Social Studies of Medicine & Department of Equity, Ethics, and Policy, McGill University) is available with an expected start date of September 1, 2023. The successful candidate will have demonstrated expertise in mixed-methods qualitative research including ethnography, qualitative interviewing, and survey development, as well as familiarity with using mixed methods data analysis software (e.g., NVivo).

The goal of the research team is to evaluate Open Science Partnerships (OSPs) within a novel paradigm-shifting preclinical platform aimed at neurodegenerative disease drug development called TRIDENT (Translational Initiative to DE-risk NeuroTherapeutics). TRIDENT brings together a group of diverse stakeholders from across Canada and internationally including experts in cellular and animal models of neurodegeneration, clinical neurology, cognition, imaging, open science and science policy, epistemology, ethics, law, and GBA+ studies, working across disciplinary and institutional boundaries to improve and accelerate preclinical assessments of candidate molecules for treating neurodegenerative disease. In OSPs, actors/stakeholders typically engage extensively and collaboratively, openly sharing all data, tools, knowledge, and materials across all members of the partnership. Moreover, a unique feature of TRIDENT is that it adopts a living laboratory framework in which the functioning of the platform from its inception and the actions and interactions of its participants are subject to critical scrutiny by our research team using qualitative research methods, with an eye towards iterative improvement of the functioning of the platform and lessons that can ground practices and policies with respect to similar types of platforms and OSPs in the drug development sector and beyond.

The position is funded through a New Frontiers in Research Fund Transformation Grant obtained by Ravi Menon (Professor, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Western) who is leading the TRIDENT team (See https://news.westernu.ca/tag/research-western/). This position offers a competitive salary ranging from \$45,000-60,000 (+benefits) per year along with excellent career development opportunities both within academia and industry. The position is for a term of one-year, with possible renewal for up to 3 years, conditional on the availability of funding and performance. Candidates must, at the time of appointment, have a PhD in Social Sciences or a related field.

The position will be held at the University of Western Ontario (Western) and will involve some travel to conduct qualitative research at TRIDENT partner institutions including McGill
