

Western University's Vision Loss in Later Life Research Lab (VITAL) invites applications for a funded Postdoctoral Associate (PDA) position as part of a critical participatory action research (CPAR) study with older adults aging with vision loss. A PhD in Rehabilitation Science, Occupational Science, Gerontology, Disability Studies, or other relevant discipline is required at the time of appointment. The position is available no later than September 1, 2022, and will be for an initial period of one year with potential to renew. Applicants must have received their PhD no earlier than September 1, 2020.

The Vision Loss in Later Life Research Lab (https://www.vitalresearchlab.com/) is in Western's School of Occupational Therapy in London, Ontario, Canada. Directed by Dr. Colleen McGrath, the lab is a collaborative and interdisciplinary environment focused on answering complex questions aimed at addressing barriers to full and equitable participation for older adults aging with vision loss.

The Postdoctoral Associate will work alongside a research collective that is comprised of researchers, graduate students, older adults with vision loss, and community partners. The project is a SSHRC-funded Insight Grant focused on enacting a CPAR process centred on the community mobility needs of older adults with age-related vision loss. The PDA will be involved in project management, supervising trainees, overseeing data collection, analyzing data, engaging collaboratively with the research collective, developing the knowledge mobilization/social action phase of the study, writing academic journal articles, and preparing reports and presentations for funders, conferences, and community knowledge users.

The ideal candidate will be a strong writer, an organized project manager, and have research experience both in critical qualitative community-based research and working with older adults. Familiarity with ethics protocol development, grant writing, critical discourse analysis, relevant critical theoretical perspectives (i.e., critical disability perspectives, critical gerontology), and knowledge mobilization will also be considered assets.
