

Ukrainian Postdoctoral Scholarship Opportunities

Ivey Business School is initiating the 'Ivey Ukrainian Scholarship Shelter Program' and invites applications from Ukrainian academics to come to Ivey for a Postdoctoral Research Position and fill as many as 5 Postdoctoral Scholar positions in the areas of Leadership, Entrepreneurship, Operations Research/Management, and Sustainability and Energy. Candidates should either have completed a PhD in the last 5 years or be in the final stages of a PhD in Business or a closely related field. Ivey will provide financial support for travel to the successful candidates, and subsequently provide support to find housing prior to their arrival. Successful candidates will provide support and work collaboratively with the affiliated faculty. Applicants across various disciplinary backgrounds, such as business, economics, strategy and policy will be considered. Candidates should possess strong methodological research skills (empirical, analytical, behavioral, etc. depending on the role).



The appointment will be twelve months starting July 1 2022, and applications will be accepted until the position has been filled, with possible extensions after the first year. The annual salary is \$75,000 Canadian Dollars including benefits and health care. The position will be based in London, Ontario.

Candidates interested in the position should submit a letter of intent specifying the discipline to which they're applying, vitae with full description of curriculum and research experience/interest, one or two sample papers, and names and contact information of two references to postdocapplications@ivey.ca. The position is subject to budget approval. Applicants should have fluent written and oral communication skills in English. This posting is being advertised under the "Jobs for Ukraine" umbrella, and preference will be given to individuals who identify as Ukrainian and are living in Ukraine, or are replaced, who wish to come to Ontario to flee the conflict in Ukraine.

About the Role

- The applicant's PhD must have been granted within five years prior to the proposed start date of the Fellowship at Western and all PhD requirements must have been met by the start date of the award.
- The applicants must submit the following documents: research project proposal, contact information of two academic referees, CV, and proof of PhD.
- Annual Salary of \$75,000 CAD including benefits and health care
- The position is a one-year position starting in July 2022

Postdoc in Operations Research

- PhD in a related field (e.g., management science, industrial engineering, mathematics, computer science, economics, statistics)
- Research experience/interests in operations research, optimization, mathematical modelling, machine learning
- Applications can include supply chain management, healthcare, transportation, network design, scheduling

Postdoc in Leadership:

- The ideal applicants must already have, or be nearing completion of, their doctorate in organizational behaviour or related field and have strong empirical research skills, as demonstrated by prior research projects, doctoral work, publications, or employment experience.
- Research experience in the field of leader character, character strengths, and virtues is a must.
- The successful candidate will be working with Gerard Seijts and other members affiliated with the Institute for Leadership.

Postdoc in Building Sustainable Value (BSV):

- Because the centre aims to foster cross-disciplinary research, doctorate degrees from different streams within management (i.e., strategy, operations management, accounting, entrepreneurship) and neighboring fields (i.e., industrial ecology, sociology, psychology) are considered eligible. The candidate should have strong empirical research skills and/or analytical skills, as demonstrated by prior research projects, doctoral work, publications, or employment experience.
- Research experience in the field of sustainability (e.g., climate change, circular economy, sustainable finance, sustainable innovation, social justice) is a must.
- The successful candidate will be working with one or more members affiliated with the building Sustainable Value centre in one of our impact areas (i.e., climate change, circular economy, sustainable finance, sustainable innovation).

Postdoc in Energy:

- PhD in a related field (e.g., economics, law, public policy, management science, statistics) with a focus on energy and/or environmental topics
- Research experience/interests in working on emerging energy and environmental policy, infrastructure and commodity market topics with an emphasis on energy transition
- Applications should include a focus on electrification, hydrocarbons and the environment and/or energy regulation

Postdoc in Entrepreneurship:

- PhD in a related field (e.g., entrepreneurship, economics, strategy, management, public policy, sociology) with a focus on entrepreneurship in all its forms.
- Research experience/interests in one or more of the following areas: entrepreneurial cognition; social entrepreneurship; high growth entrepreneurship; geography of entrepreneurship; gender and minority entrepreneurship; international entrepreneurship; entrepreneurial support organizations.
- The successful candidate will work with one or more faculty members affiliated with the Morrissette Institute for Entrepreneurship and contribute to research efforts in one of our impact areas.
